WHAT IS EDGE WORKSHOP?

Edge Workshop is a programme for boys aimed at learning simple hands-on skills and through this the development of self esteem, resilience and better life skills.

It is a programme that is packed full of activities that boys enjoy most, like construction, adventure, small and engaging projects, fast and energetic games and as much boy against boy competition as possible.

Programmes are tailored to primary and intermediate boys aged 8-12 and we work within the school structure. The programme encompasses the needs of a small group of boys selected by the school to be involved. Specific outcomes can be raised by the school before the programme commences.

It is unique in that it is a flexible partnership programme hosted during regular school hours, either at lunch time or during class, with trained volunteers led by a paid BB facilitator.

In other words Edge Workshop is the perfect solution for boys who seem to be struggling with either the school curriculum, or external circumstances such as their home environment.





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WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF EDGE WORKSHOP?

We have found, through years of experience of working with boys, that they respond positively to the learning of values and life skills.

The target area is specifically boys who:

- Engage better with kinaesthetic learning
- Have learning challenges
- Are disengaged from learning in school
- Have a need for creative experience
- Require literacy improvement
- Are generally disconnected from society due to social difficulties

It is provided at no cost to parents or the school, it is 100% funded by BB and its partners.







WHAT ARE DUR GOALS?

Edge workshop aims to:

- Positively impact boys with a well targeted programme
- Provide hands on experiences that build self esteem and life skills
- Allow boys to discover and use tools in a way that may not be available elsewhere
- Help boys achieve better outcomes at school and in their wider social environment
- Intervene in boys' lives early which will help avoid major problems in the future
- Support educators by intervening with challenging students and improving their class learning atmosphere





EDGE WORKSHOP – A WELL PROVEN INTERVENTION

27 schools participated in Edge Workshop in 2023, with **671** boys individually reached and all positively impacted.

It is delivered locally at your school through any facilities available, or in an Edge Workshop mobile trailer brought onto school grounds, with the boys working outdoors.

We work across six regions of New Zealand

Auckland | Waikato | BOP | Canterbury | Dunedin | Central Otago

Numbers required for a programme

Edge Workshop requires a minimum of 6 students per session to be viable, this is usually supplemented by a volunteer from the school to assist with delivery. The standard Edge Workshop programme runs for 8 weeks of the school term.

Once the minimum threshold is agreed with the school, the school can select the boys to be involved, or have teacher referrals (eg - after parent teacher meetings where concerns are raised), or ask for volunteers from the classroom itself.

The frequency and size of each programme is established in partnership with the school - however the small numbers are vital to the programme being successful and inclusive. The boys really value and respond to one on one time with male role models.

Who Runs Edge Workshop

The programme is delivered by BB New Zealand, previously known as Boys Brigade, using trained volunteers but each programme is also led by a paid BB facilitator. While BB New Zealand has a Christian background and this is integral to the wider movement, the Edge Workshop facilitators are sensitive to the multicultural and diverse religious backgrounds students come from. Values based discussions are part of the curriculum and these are aligned with the value objectives of the school. The main themes are Discipline, Integrity, Respect, and Tenacity. (D.I.R.T.)
